Here the result from DH1NFL from JO50VF:

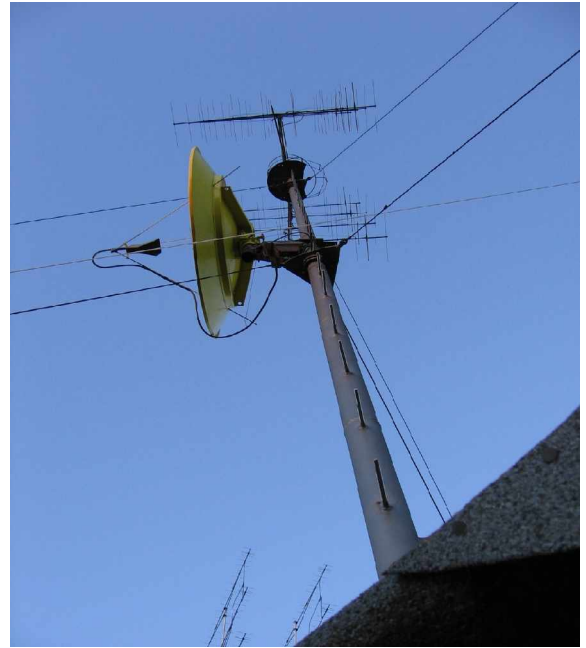
433 QSOs, 70 worked Squares, 17 countries, 300Km/ QSO and 129 995 points.

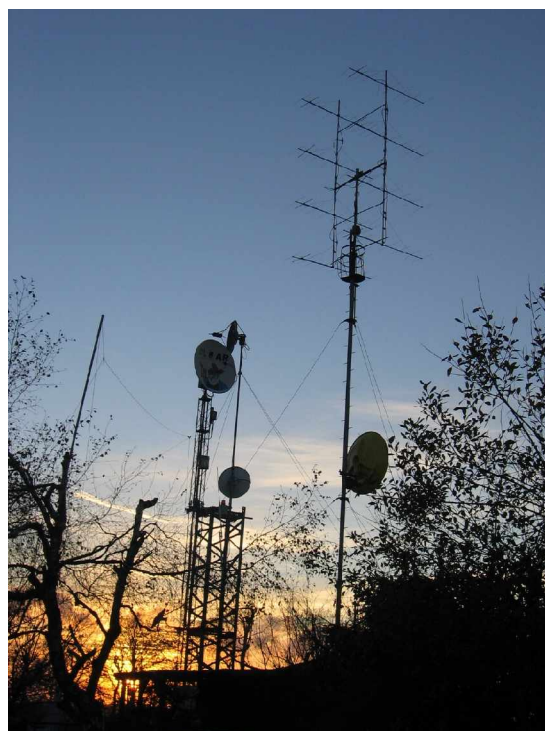
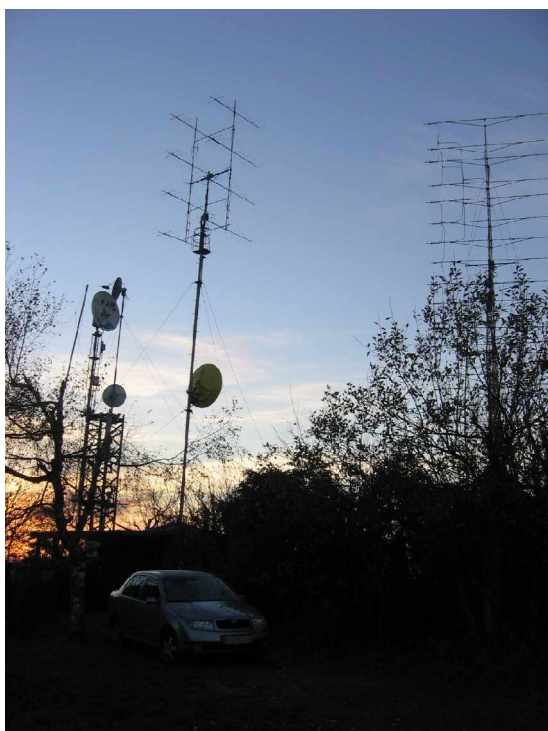
Thomas concentrating to decode the CW- signs
